I'm going to see a concert by the

They are called an orchestra.

They are a large group of people who all play instruments
and make music together.

I will see the concessions stand, but it will not be open.



Inside, someone will tell us where to go
and help us get to our seats.
They are called an usher.

This concert is General Admission.
It is my choice where I would like to sit.

I may have to go down a long hall to get to my seat.



I will go into a theatre.

It is big with lots of seats and a big, lighted stage.



There will be lots of other people in the theatre too.

It may be loud, so I can cover my ears, squeeze one of my toys,
or hold someone's hand.



The theatre will get quiet.

I will try to be quiet during the show
So I can hear everything.



I will see musicians on stage with instruments.

There will be one person who is leading them.

They are called the conductor.



Sometimes the music will be soft.

Sometimes it will be loud.

If it is too loud, I may wear headphones or cover my ears.

If it is too loud, I can leave the theatre
and go somewhere quieter.



At the end of the music, people will clap.
Sometimes, they'll stand up too!

Clapping tells the musicians I liked what I heard.

When I hear people clap, if I want to,
I can clap too.



After the show is over, we'll go out
of the Soldiers and Sailors Memorial Auditorium and go home.
