Some sounds will be high, and some will be low.

Some sounds will be loud, and some will be soft.



If it is too loud, I can leave the theatre
and go somewhere quieter.



There will be other people at the concert.

It is fun to enjoy music with people!

I will try to stay quiet enough for other people to hear the music.

It is okay for me to dance, move, or express myself with the music!



The musicians will tell us about their instruments and the music.
I will listen and learn about their jobs.



At the end of the music, people will clap.
Clapping tells the musicians I liked what I heard.
When I hear people clap, if I want to, I can clap too.



After the show is over, we'll go out
of the Chattanooga Theatre Centre and go home.
